



The Fabulous Tobruk Hex Ruler!

Perform steps 1-5 for each side of this sheet - 0-10 and 11-20.

1. Cut along the entire 'A' line.
2. Fold the remaining ABCD strip in half along the C line so that the numbers are still visible on each side. Do this carefully - you want this fold to be right on the line.
3. Fold back along the B line so that the A edge lines up with the C line, leaving the numbers (0-10 or 11-20) exposed.
4. Fold the other edge along the D line so that the edge lines up with the C line.
5. Fold the A and D sides together, leaving the B and C sides exposed. You should see the numbers on both sides now, making a ruler. Now cut along each of the two X lines on the 0-10 piece, snipping off the entire end.
6. Tape or glue both pieces shut this way, but leave the 0-10 piece open to the 9 line so you can connect the two for longer shots. The line just under the 11 line on the 11-20 piece marks how far to insert 11-20 into 0-10.

The C line lies along the map when measuring distances during the game, with the hex count visible on either side.

When measuring a shot, put the '0' mark right over the center of the firing unit. Measure to the center of the target unit, rounding up to the nearest number.

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
